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#### **Course Description**

This course intends to assist PhD students with their English language proficiency especially with regard to their academic knowledge of <u>reading</u>, <u>writing</u>, <u>listening and speaking</u>. Due attention is indeed directed primarily to academic reading and writing through exposure to different reading and writing materials. <u>Academic vocabulary and grammar</u> will be also highlighted as the course evolves.

#### **Course Objectives**

Among many objectives, students are expected to:

- get acquainted with a list of key *vocabulary for general and academic purposes*,
- learn <u>intermediate</u> level of grammar for writing and speaking,
- read texts at *intermediate* level fluently and accurately,
- speak about basic academic topics happening on campus.

### **Weekly Assignments**

- Writing Assignments: The course instructor will assign a writing task <u>every other week</u> and the students are required to upload their writings in CW in due time.
- **Speaking Task:** Students should choose a book/newspaper article/research paper and give a presentation in <u>10-15 minutes</u>. Depending on the class time, this task can be either <u>done in class or recorded</u> and sent to the course instructor. A sample speaking task will be shared with the students to follow.
- Grammar & Vocabulary Workbook Exercises: Students are required to do the workbook exercises in their vocabulary and grammar books before each session starts.
